

July 7, 2020

REGULAR MEETING

The Regular Meeting of the Hempfield Township Board of Supervisors was held on Tuesday evening, July 7, 2020, at 7:00 P.M. in the Township Municipal Building.

All of the Supervisors were present. Richard G. Stanley of 8 Fox Creek Drive was also present.

Chairman Gary Hittle called the Regular Meeting to order.

Chairman Hittle opened the meeting for Public Comment. There was none.

Chairman Hittle said he would entertain a motion to dispense with the reading and approve of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of June 3, 2020. Supervisor Geisel made the motion, Supervisor Todd Hittle duly seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried. Chairman Hittle said the minutes are a public document and may be viewed at any time during regular business hours.

Chairman Hittle said that there are activities for the Hempfield Township Volunteer Fire Department which must be approved by the Supervisors at this time. They are: July 2-Training; July 13- Directors/Membership meeting; July 16- Training; July 18- Golf Outing Fundraiser; July 21- Mercer County Fire Chiefs Meeting; July 30- Training; July 31- Boot Drive; August 1- Family Picnic/Boot Drive. Supervisor Geisel made a motion to approve the activities mentioned. It was duly seconded by Supervisor Hittle and unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried.

Next on the Agenda is the viewing of reports of the various Township departments. The police report for the month of June was first presented. The men worked 734 man hours and traveled 4,517 miles. They issued 3 traffic citations, and 10 non-traffic citations. There were 4 accidents with 2 injuries. There were 100 criminal-related incidents, 431 service incidents, 30 police information, and 71 additional traffic related incidents. Property stolen was in the amount of \$1,062.80 with \$1,062.80 recovered. No property was damaged.

There were 2 zoning permits issued by the Zoning Administrator for the month of June. They were issued as follows: Roy and Ruth Byler of 226 Donation Road for a Horse/Hay Barn at an estimated market value of \$12,000.00; Jon Ross of 620 Methodist Road for a deck/swimming pool at an estimated market value of \$4890.00.

The Maintenance Report for June was reviewed next. Mowed berms along Township Roads and at State/Township Road intersections; Replaced culvert pipe at Saul Avenue and South Park Blvd.; Replaced cross pipe on Quailvue Road; Replaced cross pipe on Woodshire Road; Replaced culvert pipe along St. Glory Road; Piled up millings in Township Storage Yard; Removed downed trees from Quarry Hill Road; Cut up downed trees at Park; Trimming around rode signs and street signs in the Township; Mowed at Bigler Cemetery; Paint Bridge abutments

on St. Glory Road; Put up new street signs to replace stolen signs; Inspected Ford Pick Up Truck; Worked on Dixon Mower; Worked on John Deere Backhoe; Sprayed weeds at Park; Weed eat and cut grass at Park; Washed HTPD vehicles numerous times; Finished culvert replacement along Hittle Ave.; Spread mulch at Township Building; Cleaned storm drains near Waugh Avenue; Cut hanging vines/broken limb along Salem Road; Measured for catch basin at Templeton and Durst; Cleaned blocked sewer line along Hadley Road; Replaced culvert along Ruth Street; Trimmed shrubs/bushes in Hollywood Blvd. island; Cut road to make patches along Quartermile Road; Repaired curbing along Woodshire Road; Changed ignition coils in Ex-Mark Zero Turn Mower; Trimmed trees in Park; Marked numerous PA One Calls; Mortared joints at catch basin on Quailvue and Woodshire Roads; Replaced rear end differential on GMC Dump Truck; Serviced HTPD Unit#2; Inspected repaired sewer laterals in Township; Weed eat and gut grass at dry pond along Woodfield Drive; Trimmed along sidewalk at Hadley Road; Ste up Park for rentals.

Chairman Hittle opened the miscellaneous portion of the meeting. There were no comments.

Chairman Hittle said he would make a motion that checks be issued in payment of all utility bills, and that all other bills be checked and upon approval, be paid. Supervisor Geisel made that motion, Supervisor Hittle duly seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried.

There being no further business, Supervisor Hittle made a motion to adjourn. The motion to adjourn was duly seconded by Supervisor Geisel, and unanimously approved by Chairman Hittle. Motion carried.

Chairman Hittle declared the Meeting adjourned.
